



The Kamchatka characters invite you to their home... Habitaculum.


The artists live in this place. They have just arrived, and they their experiences with want to be accepted by our them. In this work they society without erasing their past, without giving up their identity.

Whatever the place or time, life in the houses of recently arrived immigrants, their 'Habitaculum', runs according to the rules of their own culture.

This place is a bridge between their past and their present. It reflects their history and their lives.





The Kamchàtka language has no words, but is based on feelings. It breaks down the language barrier. It uses simplicity as the mainspring of an essential and indispensable cooperation between people by arranging for encounters between different cultures and social classes.



This is where these people live, this is where they give us a glimpse of their personal world.

It is a meeting place, a LIVELY place where one learns to share with others and to live simply.

It is here that you will mix with them.

Words are superfluous. Here, it's your feelings that speak.

Will you be able to live together?

Could we live together in a different way?





They welcome you and you discover their dwelling, in other words: their journey, their memories, their wishes and their illusions, their nostalgia...

This story may be universal, and it may also be yours.

Gradually you start to feel at your ease, you begin to understand their rules.

These new neighbours arouse your humanity, the surprise and simplicity of a different way of living.

Habitaculum is a unique experience, a journey through a living installation.



These newcomers with their unfamiliar traditions and customs show us the universal need to look into each other's eyes, to touch and to move each other.

Contact with the other arises out of essentials and out of simplicity.

Feeling, touching, playing...

with the freedom of someone who does not know and does not judge.



In Habitaculum, one arrives at intimacy by breaking the fixed rules, the rules that get in the way of knowing and accepting the other, and which make true communication impossible.





Habitaculum is a quest in this one place:

Integrating and being absorbed into each new living space.

During the setting-up and as part of the site specific creation the artists will research the location history and might use objects and furniture found on location.
